Residency Program Overview

Our orthopedic residency program runs from August through September of the following year. Depending on our clinic availability, candidates and mentors, we take between 2-4 residents for each location. Our programs are offered in: Boston, MA; Greenville, SC; and Dallas, TX (starting in 2026).

Residents dedicate 32 hours per week to patient care while receiving a full salary for their residency education. This educational component comprises 4 hours of one-on-one mentorship, 4 hours of didactic education, and 3-4 hours of specialized practice observation.

Our residents rotate between different clinics to different patient populations as well as different mentors. Residents typically treat in 2-4 clinics throughout the year, though some locations may remain the same if locations are not drivable. If that's the case, we provide a variety of mentorship experiences during the year. All clinics are within driving distance of their central location.

We have a full pay residency that is valued at \$15,000, and we provide full coverage of that cost with a 2-year commitment to ATI following successful completion of the residency, which can be served at any location with an open position in the company.

Admission Requirements

Residents must be licensed clinicians at the time they start the residency program in the state where they are enrolled in the program (usually SC). We are looking for candidates who are willing to learn, have a strong passion for their area of interest, are flexible, and demonstrate effective communication and teamwork.
