Post-Graduate Year 1 Residency Program

We are seeking dedicated and motivated candidates with collaborative mindsets for our ASHP accredited residency program. Pharmacy residents at Providence Holy Family Hospital will build on the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and abilities gained from a professional pharmacy degree program to improve clinical knowledge, leadership abilities, process development, teaching/precepting skills, and multidisciplinary teamwork.

Our program is designed to meet the American Society of Health System Pharmacists requirements and residents will work in a patient centered learning environment to receive a well-rounded education. Residents will encounter a diverse patient population with predominantly acute care rotations as well as ambulatory experiences. Residents will learn all aspects of hospital pharmacy including clinical, operational, and administrative.

Community-Based Acute Care Setting

Providence Holy Family Hospital is a community-based, comprehensive, and progressive acute care hospital located in north Spokane – the fastest growing area in our region. We are currently licensed for 197 beds with an average daily census of 120 patients. Multiple services are offered including but not limited to: critical care, internal medicine, surgery, oncology, and emergency medicine.

Engaged Pharmacy Department

The staff in the pharmacy department at Providence Holy Family are a supportive group of individuals involved in providing a strong residency program. We provide multiple clinical services, utilize various prescriptive authority protocols and maintain positive and strong relationships with other disciplines in the hospital to collaborate in patient care activities.

Residents working together with a pharmacist preceptor will be actively involved in all facets of patient care provided by the pharmacy team. They will have the opportunity to participate in daily clinical activities, administrative functions, manage a long-term project related to pharmacy practice and increase their clinical knowledge base.

Providence Health System

Holy Family Hospital is part of the Providence health system, one of the nation's largest non-profit health care providers, with facilities located in Alaska, California, Montana, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas and Washington. The Providence organization is driven by a belief that health care is a human right and commits to improve the health of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

Leadership Skills

Residents will manage a performance or quality improvement project throughout the residency year, giving residents the opportunity to develop their leadership abilities. Projects are all related to pharmacy practice and are supported by the pharmacy department. Residents will also participate in a required management/administration rotation where they will work with leaders, attend meetings, and work on various other projects that benefit the department. This will further enhance the residents' leadership skills development. Residents will have ample opportunity to teach and precept students as well as lead operational functions and manage technicians through staffing.

Holy Family Hospital is in Spokane in Eastern Washington, part of the Inland Northwest. Applicant Requirements

Candidates must participate in the ASHP resident matching program. Applicants must be graduates of a college of pharmacy accredited by the American Council of Pharmaceutical Education and must be licensed pharmacists or eligible for licensure in Washington State. If not licensed as a pharmacist at the beginning of residency, residents must be a licensed pharmacy intern in Washington state while working towards full pharmacist licensure. Applicants must meet all requirements for employment and meet professional requirements of the department of pharmacy.

- One official copy of college of pharmacy transcripts
