The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency offers the benefit of a unique training program. It takes advantage of a large medical center that provides complex specialty care and has a progressive pharmacy department. The wide variety of rotations and learning experiences within the acute care setting is a strength of our program. An optional ambulatory care experience produces a well-rounded graduate. Everything you learn about pharmacy practice will be based in our patient-centered mission of providing compassionate care.

Staffing requirements provide hands -on experience which exposes residents to real-life clinical and operational situations. The residents will gain experience in weekend and weekday clinical and central pharmacy services (order verification/IV room). This prepares graduates to be able to provide traditional and advanced pharmaceutical care services to a wide variety of patients in diverse practice settings.

Projects are selected by the residents from a list of opportunities identified as an area of departmental need which ensures appropriate level of support for successful completion. During the pharmacy administration rotation, the resident will work with leaders to develop and improve projects and attend department, hospital and system meetings. In addition, participation in management chats throughout the year will help the resident develop an understanding of pharmacy department responsibilities and influence.
