Providence Residency programs are built on a tradition of excellence in pharmacy services. Providence pharmacy departments in Oregon are leaders in the implementation of progressive pharmacy services. We offer diverse training opportunities in award-winning practice settings recognized for high-quality patient care. The Providence Oregon Region PGY1 Residency Program received the Pharmacy Residency Excellence Award from the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) in 2015. The ASHP Foundation presents one award annually, highlighting the achievements of select residency programs and their preceptors, staff and practice sites, which have demonstrated excellence and leadership in the training of pharmacy residents.

The PGY1 program is an integrated health system residency offering learning experiences throughout Providence in Portland. Beyond direct patient care, residents will have exposure to a variety of pharmacy practice areas, including informatics, medication safety, managed care and various specialty areas. Our PGY1 program has been accredited by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists since 1994.

The PGY2 component of the residency will offer residents unique experiences to be intimately involved on the Regional Pharmacy Leadership Team. The resident will be exposed to leaders in all levels of health-system pharmacy administration. Within a large integrated health-system, being the only health-system pharmacy administration resident during the second year will allow flexibility based on each resident's career interest.

The University of Providence School of Health Professions is proud to offer an innovative MHA component of the residency that consists of eight-week online courses with emphasis on transformational leadership, strategic planning, data-driven solutions, ethical leadership, and evidence-based practice. The program is designed to prepare pharmacists for careers that require expertise in both pharmacy and business theories and principles.

Our residents also have the opportunity to earn a teaching certificate through the Oregon Pharmacist Teaching Certificate Program, an arrangement between local residency programs, Oregon State University College of Pharmacy, and Pacific University School of Pharmacy.

About The Program

The program purpose of the PGY1/PGY2 in Health-System Pharmacy Administration and Leadership/MHA is to prepare pharmacy leaders for a management role in a variety of diverse pharmacy settings: inpatient, outpatient, ambulatory, home care, specialty pharmacy and managed care.

Program Structure

A strength of our program lies in the diversity of learning experiences available, giving residents broad exposure and practice skills in a variety of practice settings including both acute and ambulatory care. All residents rotate throughout our health system and come together regularly for meetings, conferences and projects.

Required staffing generally occurs within the acute care pharmacy departments at Providence Portland Medical Center.

Master of Healthcare Administration (MHA) Program

The University of Providence School of Health Professions allows residents in the combined PGY1/PGY2 program to simultaneously enroll in the MHA degree program. This takes advantage of efficiencies in both the residency and MHA programs, operating on a cohort model that grants students the opportunity to gain a sense of community and individual attention as they progress through the program with the same group of students.

The program is directed toward providing didactic and experiential education to MHA students that will allow them to: (1) understand the major administrative functions in organizations delivering pharmaceutical products and care to patients; and (2) design strategies and policies to cope with the evolving health care environment. Supplemental projects will aid in developing administrative, research and analytical skills, in addition to improving the resident's understanding of pharmacy practice and administration in health-systems.
