Santa Rosa Memorial is a 338 bed hospital, level 2 trauma center, located in Santa Rosa, California. We are an integral part of our community serving the greater Northern California area in beautiful wine country. Post-Graduate Year 1 (PGY-1) Residency Program

The PGY-1 Residency Program at Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital offers a large focus in the acute care setting. By serving such a large geographic area, we have a diverse patient population with a variety of patient cases that will help the resident become well-rounded in different settings and a strong clinical pharmacist by the end of the program. Residents will also be prepared, should they choose to, to apply for and thrive in a PGY-2 in variety of fields.

Candidates also be expected to obtain a Teaching Certificate with Touro University and learn to give lectures as well as precept students during their rotations.

The Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital PGY-1 program is ASHP accredited (Pending reaccreditation 2024/2025).
